Martin Luther King (Jr.) was born on 15 January 1929 at Atlanta, the southern state of Georgia in USA. Martin Luther King was highly influenced by Gandhiji's principle of non violent agitation. He visited India in 1959 to pay homage to Gandhiji and to understand the meaning of Satyagraha Movement. He adopted Gandhiji's non violent methods of protest and demanded equality for the Blacks in USA. Blacks gave him tremendous support. In August 1963, they joined him on his march to Washington. The government had to finally stop discrimination in education, employment and public places. A year later in 1964, he received the Nobel Prize for peace. In 1968, he was assassinated by a white American. But in his short span of 39 years of life he was able to give a whole race of people to live with dignity.

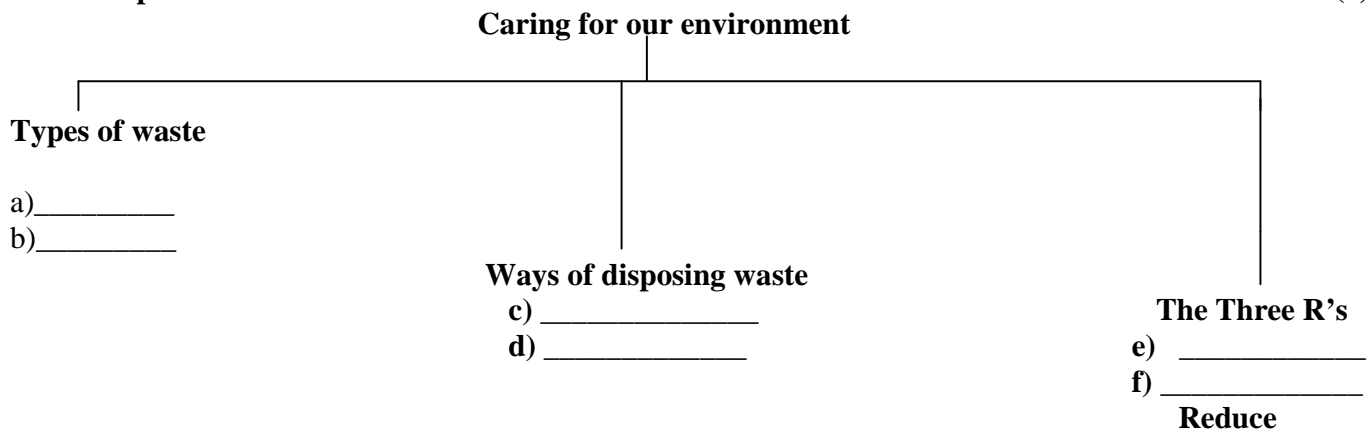
