Legal Aptitude	44 (20%)	<p><b>(a) Total Questions : 44</b></p> <p>As the candidates cannot be tested on any prior knowledge of law or legal concepts, only questions pertaining to Legal Awareness will be framed with the help of legal propositions and a set of facts such as:</p> <p>(i) Law and Judiciary</p> <p>(ii) Current and important legal facts.</p> <p>(iii) Legal Terms, which commonly occurs in lay man's language but are used some times without understanding.</p>
<b>Total Marks</b>	220 (100%)	No. of questions have been calculated according to the time given to attempt one question i.e. 30 seconds to attempt one question 220 questions x 30 seconds = 110 minutes
