From Rameswaram to the Rashtrapati Bhavan, it's been a long journey. Talking to Nona-Walia on the eve of Teacher's Day, President Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam speaks about life's toughest lessons and his mission of teaching the Indian youth. "A proper education would help nurture a sense of dignity and self-respect among our youth," says President Kalam. There's still a child in him though, and he's curious about learning new things.

Life's a mission for President Kalam. Nonetheless, he remembers his first lesson in life and how it had changed his destiny.

"I was studying in Standard V and must have been all of 10. My teacher, Sri Sivasubramania Iyer was telling us how birds fly. He drew a diagram of a bird on the blackboard, depicting the wings, tail and the body with the head and then explained how birds soar to the sky. At the end of the class, I said I didn't understand. Then he asked the other students if they had understood, but nobody had understood how birds fly," he recalls. "That evening, the entire class was taken to Rameshwaram shore," the President continues. "My teacher showed us sea birds. We saw marvellous formations of them flying and how their wings flapped.
