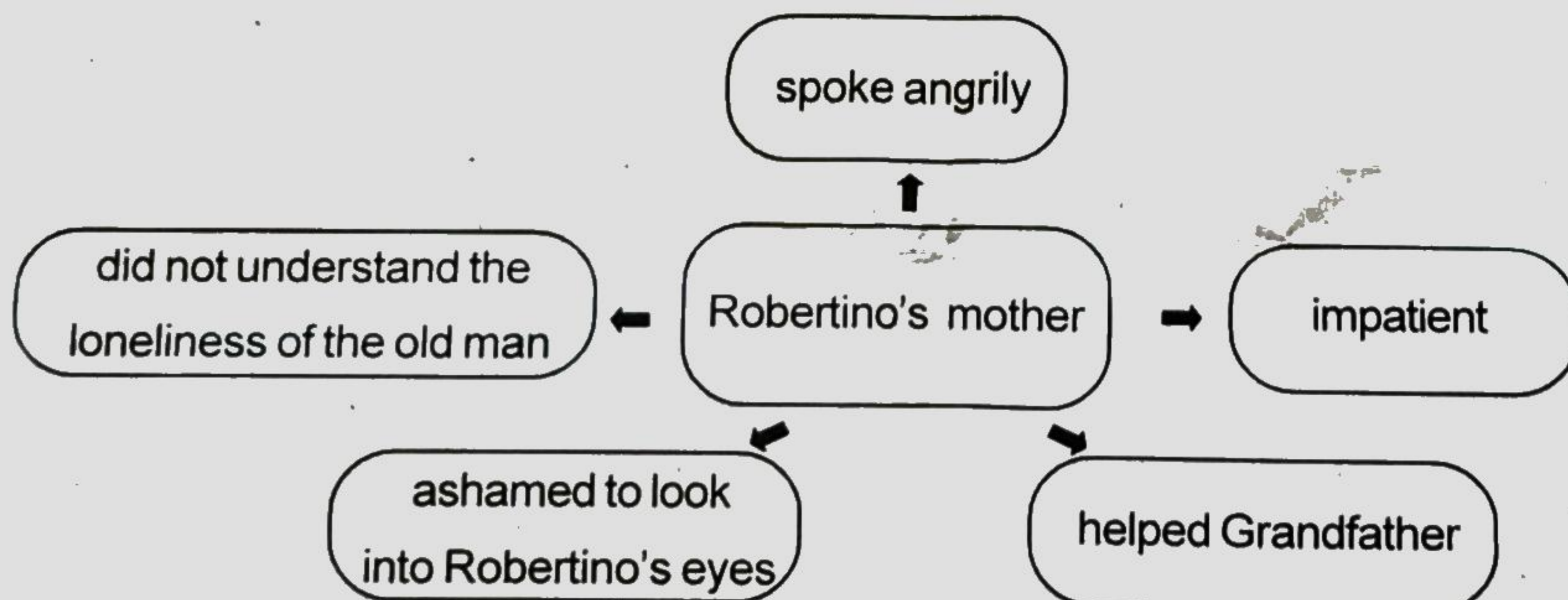
Cathy was crying with pain. Father gave the first aid and told them that Cathy would need an injection.

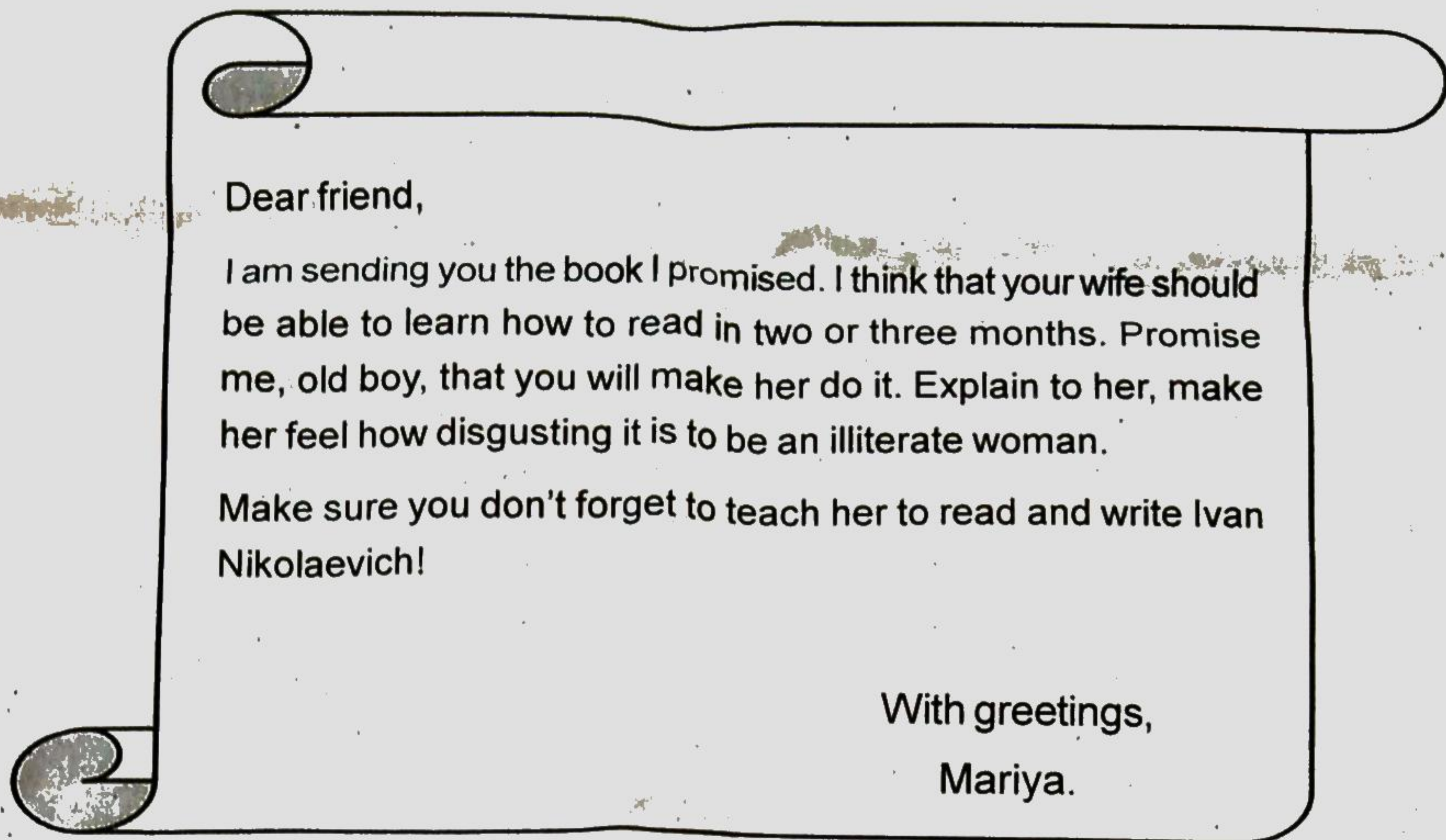
- 1 What happened to Cathy while gardening ?

Activity III - Thanks Giving Card



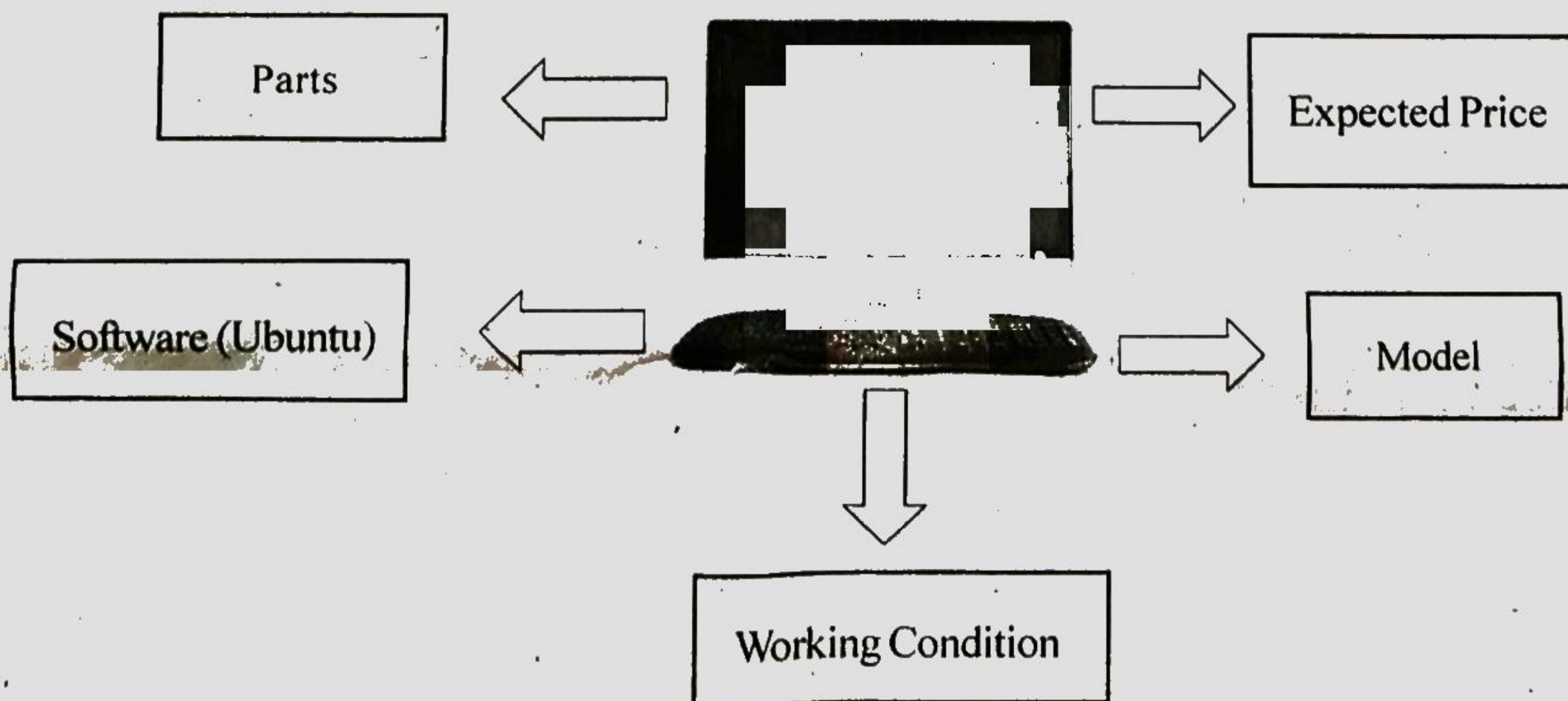
When learned to read, Polya read the letter. Her eyes were filled with tears. Polya decided to send a Thanks Giving Card to Maria.
