[Hints: The young man and his situation in the town – how lose of his parents affect him – lack of proper guidance – negative influence of friends – his gambling habit – stealing money – his attempt to suicide – role of land lady, sergeant and the doctor in bringing him back to life - his present life dedicated for humanity]
