Joseph Rudyard Kipling

Joseph Rudyard Kipling, a famous English short-story writer, poet and novelist, was born on 30th December in 1865 at Mumbai in India. His spouse was Caroline Starr Balestier. He had three children- Josephine, Elsie and John. He completed his higher education from United Services College. His famous works are *The Jungle Book*, *Kim*, *Mandalay*, *Ganga Din* and *If*. His short stories include *Rikki-Tikki -Tavi* and *The Man who would be King*. He received the Nobel prize in Literature in 1907. He was honoured with the Audie Award for Audio Drama and the Audie Award for Excellence in Production. Kipling passed away on 18th January in 1936 when he was aged 70 at Fitzrovia, London in England.

Stephen Hawking, a Symbol of Optimism

Stephen Hawking could overcome his crippling disease with willpower and optimism. He overcame his adversities with his courage and fortitude. He opted his courses and colleges for study in tune with his interests and talents. He realised that there were a lot of worthwhile things to do even though the rare disease paralysed him. He understood that life was precious if he could sacrifice himself for others. His meeting with Jane Wilde also became turning point in his life. He admired her wit and optimism. Dreams: An Appreciation

"Dreams" by Langston Hughes is a short poem of 8 lines with simple imagery and strong message. The poem highlights value of dreams in our life.

In the very first line the poet mentions the importance of dreams. According to him life is meaningless in the absence of dreams. Hence it is important to keep dreaming. In stanza 2, the poet repeats the phrase, 'hold fast to dreams' that shows how significant the dreams are for the poet. He compares life without a dream with a 'barren field frozen with snow'. A barren field serves no useful purpose. A life devoid of dreams is meaningless. Thus in both the stanzas, the poet is trying to convey that every man should keep dreaming.

The poem's impact comes from its figurative language. A metaphor appears in each verse of the poem. Life without a dream is compared to a broken winged bird. The life of a broken winged bird is meaningless. In the same way a life without dreams is meaningless. The poem is notable for its musical changes

As the poet is African, the poem can also be considered as a motivational verse for the Black people, whom Hughes urges to keep dreaming of equality, which they are yet to achieve.
