On 16<sup>th</sup> October 1905, the day the partition of Bengal went into effect, was observed in Bengal as a day of mourning. Throughout Bengal, no cooking was done and shops and market places were closed. In Calcutta a hartal was declared, People took out processions and bathed in the Ganges in the morning and then paraded on the streets singing "*Vande Mataram*." People tied *rakhis* on each other's hands as a symbol of unity of the two halves of Bengal. Later in the day Ananda Mohan Bose and Surendranath Banerjee addressed two mass meetings attended by about 75,000 people.

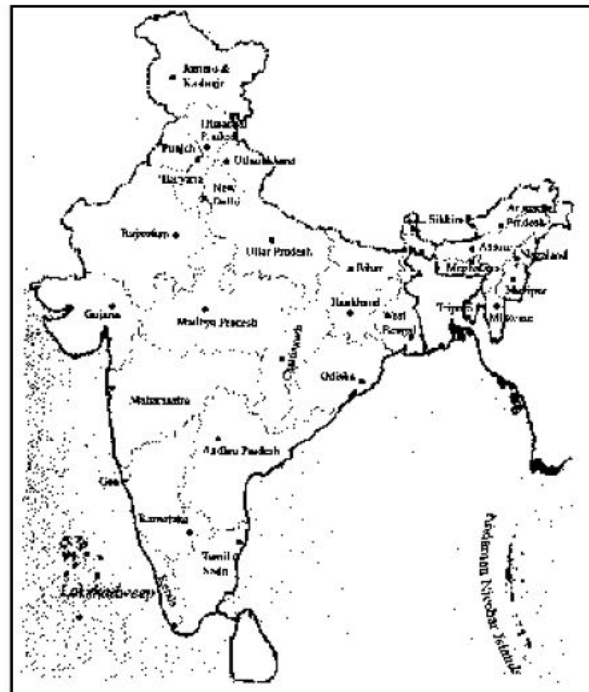


