

Traditionally, each Estate would vote as group and had one vote. As a result, the nobility and the clergy could always overrule the Third Estate. The first two Estates argued for Estate-wise single voting system, while the Third Estate (the Commons) demanded individual vote for each member of all the three estates. Various thinkers and streams of thought in France played an important role in making the people aware of the inequalities and exploitation. Voltaire • Ridiculed the exploitation of clergy. • Promoted rational thinking, ideals of equality and humanism. Rousseau • Spelled out the importance of freedom with the statement, 'Man is born free, but everywhere he is in chains'. • Declared that the people are the sovereign. The Lahore session of the Indian National Congress held in 1929 under the chairmanship of Jawaharlal Nehru was a turning point in the history of freedom movement in India.

The session declared that the ultimate aim of Indian freedom struggle was to attain complete freedom (Poorna Swaraj) for the country

It also resolved to start the civil disobedience movement under the leadership of Mahatma Gandhi.

Gandhiji selected salt as a powerful weapon against the British.

• Salt tax constituted two fifth portion of the income collected by the British through

taxes.

- This tax was a heavy burden for the poor people.
- The British government banned small scale indigenous salt production.
- There was three fold hike on salt price.
- The demand for lifting salt tax was a slogan suitable to inspire all segments of the society.
