Activity 1: Comprehension (Poem)

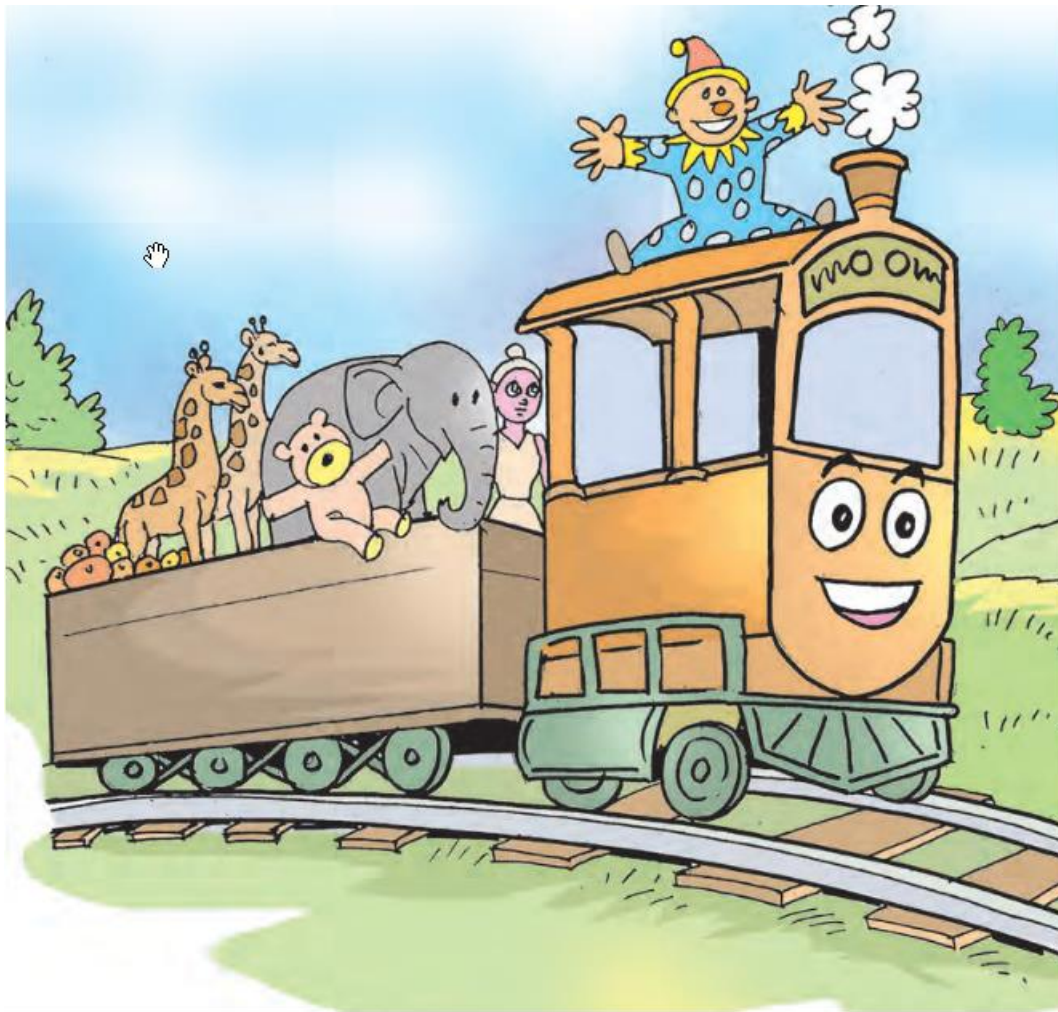
Read the following lines from the poem "*Twinkle, Twinkle, Little Star*" and answer the questions given below:
