23. Cash Credit vs Overdraft:

Feature	Cash Credit (CC)	Overdraft (OD)
Definition	A short-term loan facility where a borrower can withdraw more than their balance up to a sanctioned limit.	A facility that allows an account holder to withdraw more than the available balance in their account, up to a specified limit.
Purpose	Typically used by businesses for working capital needs.	Can be used by both businesses and individuals to manage temporary cash shortages.
Security	Requires collateral (e.g., stocks, inventory, receivables).	Can be secured (against fixed deposits, property, etc.) or unsecured (depending on bank policy).
Interest Calculation	Charged only on the utilized amount, not on the entire limit.	Charged only on the amount overdrawn, not on the entire sanctioned limit.
Repayment Terms	Usually requires periodic renewal and is repaid through business revenues.	Can be repaid anytime; the facility remains open as long as the bank permits.
Availability	Mostly offered to businesses.	Available to both individuals and businesses.
Limit Determination	Based on the value of collateral and business turnover.	Based on the borrower's creditworthiness, account history, or pledged security.

Labour Participation Rate: % of working-age population employed. Dependency Ratio: Ratio of non-workers (children, elderly) to workers.

24. Monsoon Winds: Caused by differential land-sea heating. **Trade Winds** shift the Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), triggering monsoon.

OR

Greenwich Meridian: Prime meridian (0° longitude) for global time zones. **International Date Line**: Marks calendar day change (180° longitude).

25. American War of Independence:

• Mercantilist Laws: Restricted colonial trade (e.g., Navigation Acts).

• Enlightenment Thinkers: Locke (natural rights), Paine (Common Sense).
