 - (B) List the major challenges faced by independent India, which had to be addressed immediately after 1947.
- 26.(A) What were the main **causes of the Bardoli Peasants Movement (1928)**? Explain how the agitation concluded successfully. **OR** (B) Explain the participation of **women** and **tribal people** in the Non-Cooperation Movement.
- 27. What is **Digital Literacy** and **Media Literacy**? Why are they essential in the modern age?

- 28.List and explain any four major problems that arose as a result of the **Partition of India** in 1947.
