(1) Comprehension

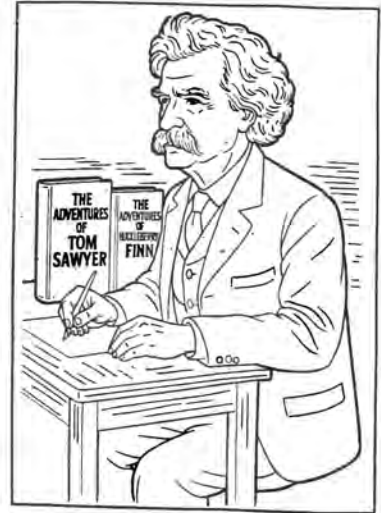
Read the passage given below and answer the following questions.
